sacramental life

Baptism

To have a child baptized, you must register and attend a class as a couple (unless attendance just isn't possible, in which case some discussion with Kathy Kehnast will be necessary). Sessions are held quarterly for both parishes. Try to attend before the child is born. Next session is tentatively planned for October 19. If you are expecting or have a new born or somehow have somehow haven't gotten around to have an older child baptized, call Kathy to make plans.

Please don't ask if you "have to go." This is an opportunity to meet with parents of children about the same age as your little one; those parents are in the same wonderful boat as you are.

At least one parent must be a practicing Catholic. Both godparents need to be practicing Catholics. If you don't attend Sunday Mass regularly (a major component of being a practicing Catholic!), there is something you can do about it: Start coming to Sunday Mass.

Penance

The priest is available for Penance

- at St Bernadette Saturdays at 3 PM and Thursdays at 5:30 PM, and
- at St Mary Bremen on Sunday at 8 AM.

In addition to Advent and Lenten Penance Services, every Catholic priest is available whenever there is a need. There are Penance opportunities for parochial school children four times during the year so that they will learn the beauty of frequent confession. The Church's law requires us to receive the sacrament of Penance at least once a year.

Anointing and Care of the Sick

The Sick receive the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick when dangerously ill, facing major surgery, or suffering from the ravages of old age. We celebrate the sacrament communally at a Sunday Mass before Advent and during the Easter season so that we can all pray with you for "health of mind and body."

And, we are happy to bring Penance, Anointing, and Holy Communion to the homes or hospitals of the sick or shut in. It is very helpful to call the parish office to let us know before a hospitalization or when it has been too long since the sacraments were last available.

Holy Matrimony

Couples wishing to marry should contact the parish office six months before they wish to celebrate the sacrament. Why so long? Because this sacrament, not just the ceremony, requires serious preparation. And the Church needs to be involved in that preparation. Remember, Catholics who marry outside the Church have left the sacramental life and need to change that situation before receiving the other sacraments.

The Church wishes to support couples through the years of their married life. That's why our diocese offers programs to enhance married life. To learn about these programs, watch the weekly bulletin.

A Christian Counseling Service Comes to Town! ... and St Bernadette Rectory Is Back in Service!

Here's the back story. I have continued to live in the rectory at Bremen St Mary (where I moved in 2006) since taking the additional pastorate at St Bernadette (in 2009). The reason was simple: Both houses are suitable, but St Mary had invested in modest but necessary upgrades when I had arrived (carpeting, flooring, painting, some new furniture). It seemed disrespectful of that investment to have more such upgrades for St Bernadette's rectory and then to leave the Bremen expenses without any usage. And, besides, with careful calculation I determined that the expense of traveling from Bremen to Lancaster and back each day is exactly the same as the trip from Lancaster to Bremen. And I realized that I would have to make the trip every day to be pastor of both parishes. So, the St Bernadette rectory stood empty. Possible uses for various parish purposes, as a home for a retired priest or some religious sisters, as well as possible rental income all came to naught. And yet a rectory needs to be available on such a location for the priest who would someday replace me.

After eight years sitting unoccupied, the rectory at St Bernadette can soon return to practical service. It has long been my impression that there is a crying need for counseling with a Catholic perspective. I have been aware for a few years that there has been a wonderful blossoming of local counseling practices in the Columbus area. But that was in Columbus, a long way off for people in crisis. I was delighted to find that at St Bernadette we could host such a long-needed service for parishioners and for our neighbors, Catholic and otherwise.

Several parishes in our diocese have agreements for such use of parish property in service of the ministry of psychological assistance for local people. To have that at Lancaster would be a great blessing. Spirit of Peace Counseling of Columbus seems to

fit the bill. It is a Christian service in which a large portion of the professional staff have solid grounding in Catholic Christian principles about the sacramental



and moral life. They are rooted in prayerful service of the Faith. They are based in northwest Columbus but have satellite centers at St Catherine Parish in Bexley, St Brendan in Dublin, St Matthew in Gahanna, St John Neumann in Sunbury, and other locations in Canal Winchester, Circleville, Grove City, and Powell.

I explained to the Spirit of Peace Clinical Counseling service leadership that, whenever there might arise a need for that rectory to serve as residence for a pastor of St Bernadette—at the retirement, death, sickness, dismissal, or whatever of the incumbent pastor—the rectory would have to be able to be returned to the sole use of St Bernadette Parish and the Diocese of Columbus. With the careful consideration of Bishop Campbell and after consultation with parish leaders, we (the bishop, the pastor, and Spirit of Peace) have entered into a carefully considered agreement. There will be no money passed between the parish and SoPCC. There will ordinarily be a charge for services to the clients by SoPCC. The use of the property is an arrangement that is "at will", and any of these parties may terminate this relationship at any time with a month's written notice to the other party.

Julie Stalford, a parishioner at St Bernadette, recently graduated with a Master of Arts degree in Clinical Social Work from Ohio University and became a licensed professional clinical counselor practicing in that field, joining the team of Spirit of Peace. She is a clinical therapist offering Catholic/Christian counseling services here at St Bernadette for greater Fairfield county. She has been approved by the State of Ohio Counselor, Social Worker, and Marriage and Family Therapist Board. She is a member of the Clinical Social Work Association. She also holds a Bachelor's Degree in Social Work and a Bachelor's in Spanish from Bradley University. Prior work experience includes extensive work overseas as a coordinator for Peace Corps, Paraguay, a religious education director at St Martins Church in Florida, and conducting women and teen retreats. She has experience in grief counseling, teen issues (including social media), women's issues, anxiety, depression, life transitions, spiritual issues, adult children of alcoholics, and the St Thomas Aquinas "Affirmation" psychotherapy discipline. In addition, she is fluent in Spanish. Julie's clientele will include children, adolescents, or adults, as individuals, families, or groups.

I and other parishioners have come to know not only of the competence she can bring to that role, but also of her lively sense of the parish's role. For two years Julie and her husband Chase (with the cooperation of their toddler daughter and infant son) have been leading the wonderful parish effort of the yDisciple youth group. From conversations about this service, I realized that Julie would provide a Catholic faith-filled service to people in need. And do that with sensitivity and kindness.

Receiving Holy Communion

When we come to Mass, we are encouraged to come to Holy Communion. So why don't we invite everyone to Holy Communion? Because it is essential that we be properly prepared for the sacrament.

First that means being a part of the Church: A communicant must be a baptized Catholic. Many Protestant communities invite everyone attending a communion service to receive Holy Communion. We respect their desire to be hospitable. But we know that we are not permitted by our own Catholic Faith to receive Communion. We Catholics (along with the Eastern Orthodox) are unique in believing something crucially different about Holy Communion: At the Consecration of the Mass, the bread and wine become, substantially, the Body and Blood of Christ. For us it is wholly inappropriate to receive Holy Communion except at the Catholic Eucharist. It is forbidden by the law of the Catholic Church to give Holy Communion to those who aren't Catholic or for us Catholics to go to Holy Communion at non-Catholic services. It is painful, but it is right. And we pray for the day when all Christians will share the one Eucharistic Faith.

And being prepared means that we must be in the state of grace. A Catholic who is married out of the Church or is aware of a serious sin which has not been confessed in the Sacrament of Penance is not properly prepared. Something can be done about that; it is not the Church's intention to exclude anyone permanently.

Finally, a Catholic who has not observed the hour-long fast (except for the hospitalized or those in a nursing home) is not properly prepared. There is a wisdom in the Church's assigning that fast: not only is there a (very) small mortification to get ready for the great Eucharistic gift of the Lord's love, but there is a protection of the privacy of a person who doesn't choose to receive communion at a given Eucharist. It never is anyone else's business why someone doesn't receive. The possibility that the person has not observed the fast just makes the pointless speculation about motive all the more useless.

Every once in a while, it is good to review what our bishops have to say about this matter.

Guidelines for the Reception of Communion

On November 14, 1996, the National Conference of Catholic Bishops approved the following guidelines on the reception of communion. These guidelines replace the guidelines approved by the Administrative Committee of the NCCB in November 1986. The guidelines, which are to be included in missalettes and other participation aids published in the United States, seek to remind all those who may attend Catholic liturgies of the present discipline of the Church with regard to the sharing of eucharistic communion.

For Catholics

As Catholics, we fully participate in the celebration of the Eucharist when we receive Holy Communion. We are encouraged to receive Communion devoutly and frequently. In order to be properly disposed to receive Communion, participants should not be conscious of grave sin and normally should have fasted for one hour. A person who is conscious of grave sin is not to receive the Body and Blood of the Lord without prior sacramental confession except for a grave reason where there is no opportunity for confession. In this case, the person is to be mindful of the obligation to make an act of perfect contrition, including the intention of confessing as soon as possible (canon 916). A frequent reception of the Sacrament of Penance is encouraged for all.

For our fellow Christians

We welcome our fellow Christians to this celebration of the Eucharist as our brothers and sisters. We pray that our common baptism and the action of the Holy Spirit in this Eucharist will draw us closer to one another and begin to dispel the sad divisions which separate us. We pray that these will lessen and finally disappear, in keeping with Christ's prayer for us "that they may all be one" (John 17:21).

Because Catholics believe that the celebration of the Eucharist is a sign of the reality of the oneness of faith, life, and worship, members of those churches with whom we are not yet fully united are ordinarily not admitted to Holy Communion. Eucharistic sharing in exceptional circumstances by other Christians requires permission according to the directives of the diocesan bishop and the provisions of canon law (canon 844 § 4). Members of the Orthodox Churches, the Assyrian Church of the East, and the Polish National Catholic Church are urged to respect the discipline of their own Churches. According to Roman Catholic discipline, the Code of Canon Law does not object to the reception of communion by Christians of these Churches (canon 844 § 3).

For Those Not Receiving Holy Communion

All who are not receiving Holy Communion are encouraged to express in their hearts a prayerful desire for unity with the Lord Jesus and with one another.

For non-Christians

We also welcome to this celebration those who do not share our faith in Jesus Christ. While we cannot admit them to Holy Communion, we ask them to offer their prayers for the peace and the unity of the human family.
